Teaching and Learning - Children deserve the highest possible standard of teaching and support to help them learn School will: Home will:

- Provide a broad and balanced curriculum which challenges and motivates children
- Celebrate academic and personal achievements
- Ensure a rich, exciting environment.

- Take an interest in what their child is learning
- Praise their child for effort and good work
- Read regularly with their child

Children will:

- Come to school ready to learn
- Respect the right to learn of others
- Contribute to the rich environment

Attendance - Children have a right to education and parents have a legal responsibility to make sure that children attend regularly

School will:

- Recover lost learning from absence
- Inform parents as soon as possible if their child is absent without an explanation from home
- Provide and early morning activity that will ready them for learning
- Support families to ensure children arrive on time

Home will:

- Make every effort to ensure their child attends school
- Makes every effort to ensure children are on time and avoid term time holidays
- Inform school as soon as possible about any absence and the reason for it

Children will:

- Attend regularly
- Arrive on time
- Arrive into class in a calm manner, ready to learn

Behaviour and Discipline - children learn best in a calm, nurturing environment where everyone knows what is expected of them

School will:

- Have a code of behavior which creates a safe and caring environment for everyone
- Make sure that all staff, children and parents know what behavior is expected
- Create class rules based on school values

Home will:

- Give praise at home for good behavior at school
- Work with school to find solutions in cases of unacceptable behavior
- Inform school of any concerns that may impact on behaviour

Children will:

- Contribute to writing the Clough/Scape code
- Ask if unsure on any school rules
- Ensure they live by the school values
- Ensure they model the behavior they expect

Homework – Learning at home has an important part to play in helping children to achieve

School will:

- Inform home of work done in school through weekly home-school work
- Provide suitable materials and advice on out of school learning

Home will:

- Offer help and support with learning at home
- Encourage their child to read regularly
- Ensure materials borrowed from school are returned

Children will:

- Take home any tasks set
- Complete home-school work or choose another way to show their out of school learning
- Read regularly and return school books

Communication – good communication between home and school is essential to make sure that children get the support they need

School will:

- Make sure that parents have information about child's progress, behavior and personal development
- Arrange for parents to discuss their child's progress and set targets for the future
- Make sure we listen to concerns and do our best to help
- Keep parents informed about school events through website, Ping and newsletter celebrating successes and fundraising efforts

Home will:

- Tell school about anything which might affect their child's work, behavior or development
- Talk with teachers on parents evenings/other times about their child's progress
- Raise concerns promptly and directly with school not on social media and provide constructive feedback to help improvements in school

Children will:

- Take home letters, notes and reports from school to give to parents/carers
- Talk with parents/carers about any concerns or worries in school
- Provide ideas, pictures and writing for the newsletters
