Year 1	<p align="center">Florence Nightingale, Mary Seacole and Edith Cavell</p> <p>Children will learn about the history of nursing and the individuals who had a significant impact on modern nursing.</p>	<p align="center">History of Transport</p> <p>Children place different types of transport correctly in order onto a timeline. They learn about ways people travelled before cars were invented.</p>	<p align="center">Victorian Schools and Seaside Holidays</p> <p>Children learn about what teaching, learning, classrooms and equipment was like in Victorian times.</p>

Class 2 - Years 2 and Year 3	Autumn Term	Spring Term	Summer Term
Cycle 1	<p align="center">Anglo-Saxons</p> <p>Learn about the withdrawal from Britain and the fall of the Roman empire. Develop knowledge of village life, art and culture and the Christian conversion. Learn about important Anglo-Saxon kings.</p>	<p align="center">Vikings</p> <p>Children understand how explain how knowledge of the Viking invasion and settlements in Britain. They will learn about the beliefs and weapons of the Viking Warriors, long ships and about famous Viking leaders.</p>	<p align="center">Local History – Huddersfield and how to be a historian</p> <p>A study of a significant topic (for e.g. work) and its affect on the local area and how it has changed over time and beyond living memory.</p>
Cycle 2	<p align="center">Changes in Britain from the Stone Age to the Iron Age</p> <p>Learn about life in Britain from the Stone Age to the Iron Age, a period covering a million years of history. Understand the chronology of time, learn about the food, religion, homes, technology and art, how each of these areas developed and changed over time and how developments occurred from the Stone Age to the Iron Age.</p>	<p align="center">Kings, Queens and Castles</p> <p>Children learn about the significant British monarchs in history, and gives a more in-depth study of Richard III as well as asking the children to draw comparisons between Elizabeth I and Queen Victoria. Children will also study medieval castles and the monarchs who lived in them.</p>	<p align="center">Ancient Egypt</p> <p>Children investigate the men and women who studied the kingdom. They will learn about the Pharaohs and the development of the pyramids and Egyptian mythology. They will look at the role of the Nile and examine daily life and compare it to life by the Nile today. Children will compare the civilisation with the society, climate and terrain of Britain at the time.</p>

Class 3 - Years 4, 5 and 6	Autumn Term	Spring Term	Summer Term
Cycle 1	<p align="center">The Ancient Greeks</p> <p>Discover the lasting influence of the Ancient Greeks on the western world. Investigate the timeline and four main periods of the Greek Empire. Explore different kinds of historical sources and evaluate their usefulness. Marvel at Alexander the Great, and the empire under his leadership. Learn about trading, research lifestyle and clothing, and study buildings. Examine the exciting Olympics and its modern legacy.</p>	<p align="center">Journeys – Migration to Britain</p> <p>We look at the Windrush generation and how their arrival influenced the town of Huddersfield. We will look at the bigger picture of why migrants came to Britain and what were their experiences in Britain.</p>	<p align="center">World War 2</p> <p>Learn about WW2 in Europe and why the Battle of Britain was such a significant turning point in British history. Learn about the timeline of events including the outbreak of the war, the Battle of Britain, the heroic rescue of Dunkirk, the liberation of the concentration camps and the celebrations of VE day. Research the lives of ordinary people who faced the Blitz.</p>
Cycle 2	<p align="center">Crime and Punishment</p> <p>This Crime and Punishment unit will teach your class to develop their chronological knowledge beyond 1066 through studying this aspect of social history. The children will find out about the legacy of the Roman justice system and crime and punishment through the Anglo-Saxon, Tudor and Victorian periods. They will also deepen their historical awareness and understanding of how our past is constructed through studying the famous highwayman Dick Turpin.</p>	<p align="center">The Luddites and The Industrial Revolution</p> <p>Learn how English textile workers rebelled against the introduction of machinery, which threatened their skilled craft. What created the towns and cities of West Yorkshire? What was life like in pre and post-industrial Britain?</p>	<p align="center">The Mayans</p> <p>Learn about the ancient Maya civilisation. Learn who the ancient Maya people were and where and when they lived. They will use maps and atlases to locate Maya cities and identify countries in Mesoamerica. Learn about the religious beliefs and rituals of the ancient Maya people and find out more about some of the many gods they worshipped. Learn about the Maya number system, have the opportunity to read and write Maya numbers, and solve number problems. They will also learn about the types of food eaten by the ancient Maya people and they will find out about the significance of corn and chocolate.</p>

<p>Cycle 3</p>	<p>Romans in Britain</p> <p>Learn about the Roman Empire and its impact on Britain at the time and the legacy it left on us. Learn about the history of Rome – legend and fact- and understand where in Europe Rome is, and how the Romans came to extend their influence and create such a large and influential empire.</p>	<p>History of Medicine</p> <p>A study of the impact of improvements in medicine over time. Focus studies of famous scientists such as Edward Jenner, Marie Curie and Marie Seacole. Find out how early Islamic doctors made significant contributions to the development of medicine and surgery and how their work still influences the medical profession today.</p>	<p>The Early Civilisation of Islam</p> <p>Learn about the early Islamic civilisation. Discover the significance and importance of Baghdad in helping to build and shape this early civilisation and examine how and why it developed into such a major world power. They will find out about the House of Wisdom and some of the influential people who worked and studied there. Provide children with the opportunity to learn about other significant discoveries and inventions made by Muslim scholars in the early Islamic civilisation and to explore how items were made and where and how they were traded with the rest of the world.</p>
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
