Foundation Subjects

Geography - This term we will start to explore the question, why do people live near volcanoes? We will look at how the earth is constructed and why and where do we get volcanoes.

Music- Children will take part in weekly glockenspiel sessions which take place every Monday. During the sessions children will learn to play the glockenspiel and practise reading music, singing and performing.

History - In history we will be finding out about the Anglo-Saxons and why they invaded Britain. We will look at their beliefs and why they converted to Christianity. We will also look at their way of life, what clothes they wore, what food they ate and their homes.

Computing - In computing we will start the term by looking at online safety and exploring IT around us,

Art: In Art, we will be using a range of drawing techniques, examining shade, tone, texture, line and shape. We will use artists such as Henri Matisse and Georgia O'Keeefe as stimulus and create drawings in their style before creating our own drawing.

RE - This will be taught in Autumn 2.

DT - This half term we will link our DT work to our science topics and explore cooking and nutrition, focusing on eating seasonally. We will look at how food comes from different places around the world and will practise cutting and peeling skills.

PSHE- This half term children will be following the My happy mind curriculum where they will explore the different parts of the brain and how these parts control our emotions. They will also explore British values in more detail.

As always, you can help your child by talking to them about what they will be learning.

English

This half term the children will develop their understanding of different grammatical concepts and language. They will learn about the differences between nouns, adjectives and conjunctions and identify these in their writing. They will create expanded noun phrases to describe and will focus on using punctuation accurately and consistently. We will explore the story 'Moon' where children will be encouraged to create their own short story about what happens in the world at night. We will continue to develop our understanding of the texts we have read in daily reading comprehension lessons. As always, we ask you read with your children as much as possible at home. It is also helpful if you can ask the children to retell stories to you, or to ask them what they think might happen next as this will deepen their understanding.

We will work on our spellings and recognition of Y2/3 common exception words. We ask that you please read with your child as much as possible to support learning at home. Children now have logins for bug club phonics (Y2) and spelling shed (Y3) which can be used at home and at school.

Science

We will start the term exploring the topics of 'movement', 'skeletons' and 'nutrition and diet'. The children will learn how to identify and name different bones in the body and will explore two different joint types and how these help the body to move. The children will learn that food can be sorted into five food groups - fruit and vegetables, carbohydrates, proteins, dairy products (and alternatives) and fats and sugars.

Please explore the local area with your child when out and about to support our learning in school.

Maths

Year 2- Children will start the term by exploring the topic of place value. The children will revisit learning from year 1 and explore numbers 1-20. They will then start to recognise how many 10s and 1s are in numbers up to 100.

Year 3- Children will start the term by exploring the topic of place value. The children will start by representing and partitioning numbers up to 100.
