Other sporting events



Class 1 News



This half term, we have been learning all about the Great Fire of London in Class 1.

We have been enjoying working in the Bakery inspired by the Great Fire in our role play area. Reception have been taking on the roles of baker and customer and working on their communication skills to buy breads, pastries and pizzas! They have also been working on their understanding of transactional conversation when handing over money and giving change. They even had a go at making some salt dough produce to sell!

Year 1 having been using and applying mathmatical skills learned this term in there too. They have been developing their understanding of money, recognising coins and notes, their values and how they can be combined to make other amounts. They have also been working on their understanding of halves, quarters and wholes by making pizzas in the bakery oven.











In our art and design work, we have been learning about sculputures and having a go at being sculptors ourselves! We began by taking one box and cutting slits and slots to make holes so we could slide other pieces of card or tubes in to create junk box sculptures. We also explored making paper sculptures by manipulating paper strips in a variety of ways, rolling, curling, fringing, looping and folding. The other media we have explored is clay. We began by exploring the feel and piching, rolling, pulling, twisting, cutting, pushing, prodding and pressing it. We are in the process of using these techniques to create our own clay tiles now!













Class 2 News




We have been very busy this half term and have enjoyed our class trip to Cannon Hall! The children learnt lots about the different farm animals, enjoyed a tour, a tractor ride and a picnic. We even had time for a spot of football!

We have learnt lots in science this term, looking at the topics of plants, forces and magnets. We had chance to work as real scientists, carrying out a plant dissection, and conducting an experiment when growing sunflower seeds. We found out that the more seeds that were planted in a pot, the more likely they were to grow the tallest sunflower!










In DT, we have worked on making different mechanisms. We learnt how to make different linkages using card and split pins. We designed and created our own moving monsters and practised the different linkage techniques.


The Linking Network with Fixby Junior and Infant School

Safeguarding Review June 2025

In June 2025, we undertook a Safeguarding review led by Vicky Holliday, one of the temporary governing board. Vicky spent time with Miss Shackleton completing the School Safeguarding Compliance Checklist as well as speaking to Mrs Senior and students. We are pleased to share with you some of the findings:

- The school has up to date safeguarding policies and procedures in place and staff use them appropriately.
- All staff have received appropriate safeguarding training with additional training underway this term or scheduled for next term.
- Staff members receive regular safeguarding updates providing them with relevant skills and knowledge to safeguard children.
- Children spoken to on the day said there was no bullying in school.
- Children said they felt safe in school and felt comfortable talking to staff if they felt unsafe/saw any bullying.
- The atmosphere in school was calm, children were engaged in their learning and appeared comfortable and engaged with staff.

Breakfast Club Updates



We're pleased to say that Breakfast Club has been a great success since launching at the start of the summer term. The children are really enjoying it—it's a great chance for them to socialise and start the day with a smile (and a slice of Mrs Senior's legendary toast!).

They've also been treated to waffles and pancakes on some mornings, which have gone down a storm.

Walking Home - Children in Years 5 and 6

We kindly ask that you contact the school office to inform us if and when your child will be walking home, specifying the days they will be doing so. Only children walking home independently, and only if absolutely essential, may bring a mobile phone to school.

If your child needs to bring a mobile phone, it must be handed into the school office upon arrival to comply with safeguarding procedures. Additionally, you will need to complete a permissions form available from the school office.

This process aligns with our Mobile Phone Policy, which we can provide upon request. Thank you for your cooperation in ensuring the safety and well-being of all our students

Free School Meals

Families who receive certain benefits may be eligible for free school meals if you are in receipt of one of the following benefits:

- Universal Credit with an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, before benefits are considered.
- Income Support.
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance.
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance.
- Support under Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999.
- The guarantee element of Pension Credit.
- Working Tax Credit run on (paid for the four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit).
- Child Tax Credit (with no Working Tax Credit) with an annual income of no more than £16,190.

Registering for the free meals raises money for school, to fund valuable support like extra tuition, additional teaching staff or school activities. This additional money is available from central government for every child whose parent is receiving one of the benefits listed above.

If your child is in full time education, and you receive one or more of the benefits stated above, please fill in an application form even if your child is in Reception, Year 1 or Year 2. This is because they are also entitled to things like free milk, help towards school trips and other support. School Meal Price Increase



Kirklees Council Catering Team have implemented a price increase on school meals. From September 1st 2025 the price of a school meal will now be £2.85.

Bikeability



In September, six children in Year 4 and **all** of Year 5 will be taking part in Bikeability at school. Please take time over the school holidays to let your child practise their cycling skills. This will help them to reach the required level of the Cycling Training Programme.

If your child is going into Year 4 in September, you will have had a Ping confirming your child's place on the Level 1 of the Cycling Programme.

Parent Pay Debts

Please check your childs Parent Pay account for any debts especially lunch debts which need to be paid immediately. Also check for any outstanding payments for school trips including Robinwood for the soon to be new Year 6's.
