Personal Development Activities - September and October 2025

Exciting Visitors and Learning Experiences This Term

We've had some fantastic visitors to school this term, enriching our curriculum and providing memorable learning experiences for the children.

B Forest School with Rosie and Maggie

Rosie delivered engaging Forest School activities, where children explored our grounds, learned about seasonal changes, and completed interesting tasks using tools. The sessions were hands-on, educational, and thoroughly enjoyed by all.

() Slaithwaite Fire Station Visit

Class 3 welcomed firefighters from Slaithwaite Fire Station, who shared important fire safety advice, discussed how to care for our moorland, and taught children how to stay safe around Bonfire Night. They also introduced potential careers in the fire service, inspiring some future firefighters!

Road Safety Workshops

Children in Classes 1 and 2 took part in road safety sessions, learning how to cross roads safely, the importance of walking to school and how to stay safe in our local area.

Celebrating Black History Month (British Values)

Throughout the month of October we have celebrated black history month. During the British values assemblies we have explored different significant people and learnt how they have helped shape our world today. The children have explored Dr Martin Luther KIng's civil rights movement, Mary Seacole's contributions during the Crimean war and Harriet Tubman's escape from slavery.


Science - The Human Body

6 - Touch





Geography - What is it like here?

Year 1 have been exploring our school both inside and out. They have been developing their fieldwork skills by following ariel view images and locating key parts using simple map symbols. They then created their own maps of the grounds to include key places and created a key using map symbols.

In their Understanding of the World, Reception have been investigating autumn and the changes which are occurring. They have also been looking closely at natural objects and using them to explore their senses and as a stimulus for some art work.















Class 2 News

History



The children have really enjoyed this half term's history topic of the Stone Age. They have explored this in many of our English texts including the books 'The Stone age boy' and 'Ug' and have wrote some brilliant diary entries and written conversations using speech! They have explored what life was like for the stone age people and how they survived by hunting and making tools. They have explored images of cave art in their studying and this has inspired a fantastic collaborative piece of art work which will be displayed in the hall soon!

Geography



To start the half term we have explored the question, 'Would you like to live in a hot or cold place?' The children have learnt about the 7 continents of the world and have enjoyed learning our continents' song to help them remember them! We have found out where the north and south poles are and what countries are close to the equator by exploring the atlases.

Science







In science, this term we have been learning about animals including humans. The children have worked hard to classify animals into the 5 main animal groups. We even managed to get outside between the wet and windy weather to do some bird spotting! The children will now continue looking at humans in more depth after the half term.


Class 3 News

Class 3 - Discovering Ancient Greece

Class 3 have thoroughly enjoyed learning about Ancient Greek civilisation this term. We've explored how the Greeks shaped the modern world, particularly through the development of democracy and the origins of the Olympic Games.

The children have been captivated by Greek mythology, diving into stories such as *Theseus and the Minotaur*, *The Trojan Horse* and *Daedalus and Icarus*. These tales have sparked thoughtful discussions about the morals they convey, as well as the magical and adventurous elements that make them so engaging.


It's been a brilliant way to bring history to life and inspire curiosity across the class.



In Religious Studies, Class 3 have been exploring how ancient stories continue to shape modern-day celebrations and values. We began with the story of the Good Samaritan, discussing how its message of kindness and compassion inspired the creation of a well-known charity today.

We then learned about Hanukkah, which dates back to Ancient Greek times. The children discovered how Judah Maccabee led the Jewish people to reclaim their temple from King Antiochus, fighting for the right to worship one God. When the temple was restored, a small amount of oil miraculously lasted eight days—an event that became the foundation of the Hanukkah festival and its customs.

These stories have helped us reflect on how faith, resilience, and tradition continue to influence the world around us.



Class 3 Art Update

Class 3 have been getting really creative in art this half term! We've been working on our drawing skills and learning how to use our sketchbooks to capture ideas, practise techniques and express our creativity.

We've had fun drawing birds and flowers, using different techniques like line, tone, texture, pattern, and shading. Everyone's been encouraged to look closely, experiment and find their own style.

We also explored Ancient Greek vases—looking at how they told stories and celebrated Greek culture. The children designed their own vase patterns inspired by what they learned.

More recently, we've been experimenting with watercolour pencils and pastels to create abstract art, taking inspiration from 21st-century artists. It's been a great way to explore colour, shape, and emotion in a more free and expressive way.

Walking Home - Children in Years 5 and 6

We kindly ask that you contact the school office to inform us if and when your child will be walking home, specifying the days they will be doing so. Only children walking home independently, and only if absolutely essential, may bring a mobile phone to school.

If your child needs to bring a mobile phone, it must be handed into the school office upon arrival to comply with safeguarding procedures. Additionally, you will need to complete a permissions form available from the school office.

This process aligns with our Mobile Phone Policy, which we can provide upon request. Thank you for your cooperation in ensuring the safety and well-being of all our students

Moving from Integris to Arbor

We are in the process of moving our software system from Integris to Arbor as Integris is being discontinued in February. Although Arbor will allow payments and communications to be processed through it, we will continue to use Ping and Parent Pay for the time being.

Free School Meals

Families who receive certain benefits may be eligible for free school meals if you are in receipt of one of the following benefits:

- Universal Credit with an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, before benefits are considered.
- Income Support.
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance.
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance.
- Support under Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999.
- The guarantee element of Pension Credit.
- Working Tax Credit run on (paid for the four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit).
- Child Tax Credit (with no Working Tax Credit) with an annual income of no more than £16,190.

Registering for the free meals raises money for school, to fund valuable support like extra tuition, additional teaching staff or school activities. This additional money is available from central government for every child whose parent is receiving one of the benefits listed above.

If your child is in full time education, and you receive one or more of the benefits stated above, please fill in an application form even if your child is in Reception, Year 1 or Year 2. This is because they are also entitled to things like free milk, help towards school trips and other support.
